With a commitment to raising standards within the working environment and a desire to embed a craft culture that will endure for future generations, Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop have developed a Best Practice Programme. In 2021, it established the DALTAE Training Programme.



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## ABOUT DALTÆ

Derived from an age-old Gaelic word meaning 'pupil', the **DALTÆ Training Programme** at Joseph Walsh Studio offers individuals the opportunity to learn alongside the makers who work in this exceptional workshop.

Under the direction and guidance of the Workshop Leader and senior members of the team, DALTÆ candidates will complete an intensive programme that includes both one-to-one instruction as well as practical workshop time. In progressive steps, working as full-time paid apprentices over a three-year period, candidates will complete a programme that begins with the founding principles of making and basic woodworking skills, before moving on to more advanced methods and an understanding of the complex and highly developed techniques that are unique to Joseph Walsh Studio.







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With the Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop Best Practice Programme at its core, the DALTAE Training Programme will include continual assessment and review, however, it is designed to allow candidates to fully absorb and understand each step before moving on to the next. All textbooks and PPE will be provided throughout the three-year programme. In practical terms, the programme will immerse candidates in all aspects of the Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop including:

## Making

- Assisting makers in a variety of tasks, as assigned.
- Developing the skills necessary to enable them become an assistant maker in the Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop.
- Undertaking assignments to support various aspects of the workshop such as model making, packing and crating.





## Project Development and Co-ordination

- Mapping out project and materials plans for allocated projects.
- Reviewing project plans with the project leader.
- Updating project documentation to reflect agreed making process improvements.
- Direction and instruction in how the Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop team works closely together to realise complex and large commissions.



The DALTAE Training Programme provides each candidate with a wealth of skill and experience while also, importantly, gaining an appreciation of the Joseph Walsh Studio ethos of integrity in the work, mutual respect and a shared commitment to continual learning. Those who successfully complete the three-year programme may be offered the opportunity of a full-time role at Joseph Walsh Studio Workshop.

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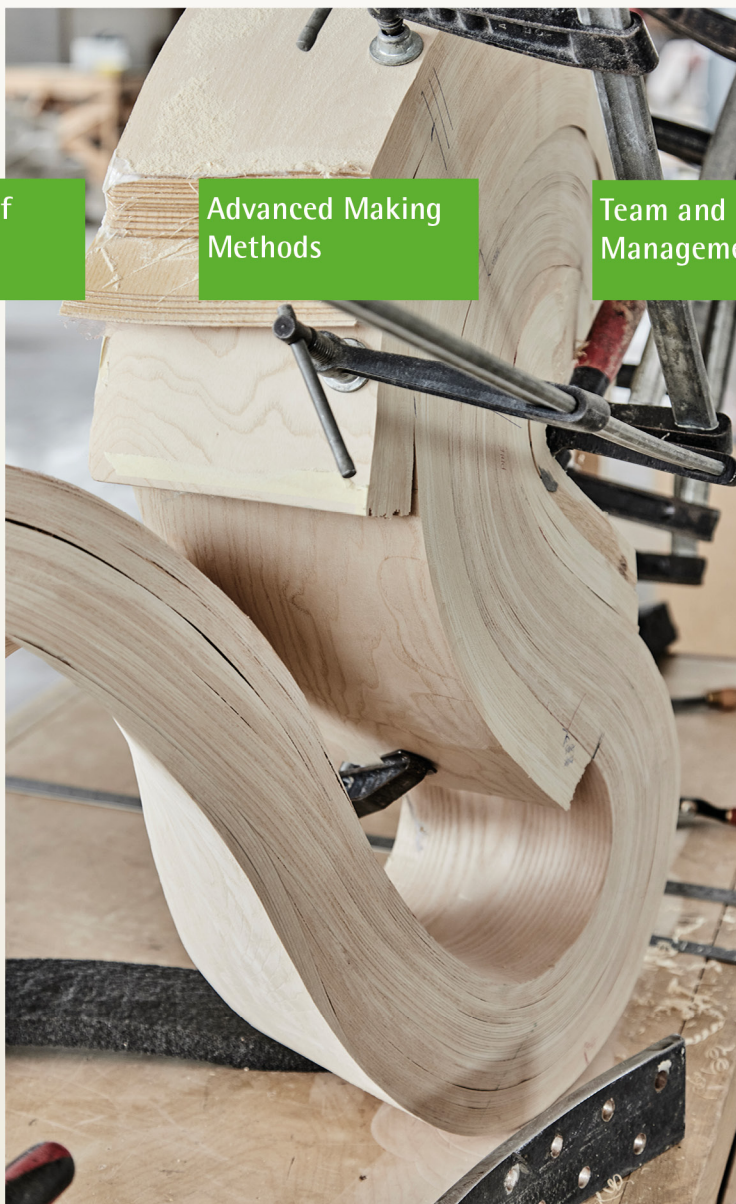
